Top moves announced in February 2022



Pembina Pipeline
Corporation appointed
Scott Burrows (left) as
the company's president
and chief executive officer.
Burrows, who previously
served as the company's

chief financial officer, was appointed interim president and CEO after **Mick Dilger** stepped down late last year. Pembina also appointed **Jaret Sprott**, senior vice-president and chief operating officer, pipelines and facilities; and **Eva Bishop** as senior vice-president, corporate services. Bishop joins Pembina from **BP Europa**, where she served as a non-executive director, and Sprott was Pembina's senior vice-president and chief operating officer, facilities.

In a corresponding move, the company says

His previous role was ARC's

vice-president, operations. Lara Conrad (bottom photo), who has been an ARC employee since 2011, is now senior vice-president and chief development officer. Her most recent role was senior vice-president, development. Ryan Berrett, now senior vice-president, marketing, was previously ARC's vice-president, marketing. Lisa Olsen, now senior vice-president, people and corporate, had been the company's vice-president, human resources.

Management and executive changes

- Ian Anderson is <u>retiring</u> from his position as president and CEO of Trans Mountain Corporation. The board of directors will begin an immediate process to select a replacement. Anderson's retirement as CEO and departure from the board are effective April 1, 2022.
- Elisabeth Brinton stepped down after less than two years as Shell plc's head of renewable energies. Brinton first joined the company in 2018 as global vice-president strategy and portfolio of Shell new energies. In corresponding moves, Shell created two new positions in its renewables leadership group. Thomas Brostrøm, who had been senior vice-president of renewables, will be appointed head of renewable generation. Steve Hill, executive vice-president for Shell Energy, will be appointed head of energy marketing. Both roles report into Wael Sawan, head of integrated gas and energy solutions.
- Blair Eddy expanded his leadership role to president and chief operating officer at Enhance Energy, effective March 1. A professional engineer who has extensive knowledge of CCUS in Western Canada, Eddy has more than 10 years of involvement with all aspects of the Weyburn CCUS CO2 EOR project. Outgoing president Kevin Jabusch will transition to executive chairman, continuing his role in guidance and leadership at the board and executive level, says the company.
- In addition, Chris Kupchenko was appointed vice-president of corporate strategy and development of Enhance. He has 16 years of varied industry experience, including the last three as director of development at Enhance. The company also appointed Brendan McGowan executive director of reservoir development. McGowan has led Enhance's technical team since 2015. Enhance also added Candice Paton as executive director of regulatory affairs and external relations.
- Scott Hierath joined the Alberta Chamber of Resources as its executive director, effective Feb. 1, 2022. Hierath, who has more than 20 years of private and public sector experience, recently served with the Alberta government as senior advisor to the Energy Minister Sonya Savage.
- Chris Lina has been <u>appointed</u> to Kiwetinohk Energy Corp.'s senior leadership team. With extensive oil and gas, and petrochemical, mega-project engineering and

- execution experience, Lina steps into the role of vicepresident, projects.
- Braya Renewable Fuels announced a new senior leadership team for its Come By Chance refinery facility in Newfoundland and Labrador. The appointments include Frank Almaraz as chief executive officer, Jim Stump as president, Josh Bailey as chief commercial officer and Luigi Trigilio as vice-president of logistics. Come By Chance refinery is strategically located, with world-class logistics assets, to source global feedstocks and to sell renewable products into the United States, Canada and Europe, said the company.
- Mohamed Attia has been appointed vice-president of geospatial and advanced technology at GeoVerra, a geomatics firm. Prior to this role, Attia was director of pipeline integrity and advanced technologies. He is a professional geomatics engineer with a PhD from the University of Calgary and has more than 18 years of professional experience.
- Robert (Bob) Merasty has been <u>hired</u> as executive director of the <u>Indigenous Resource Network</u>
 (IRN). The former chief of Flying Dust First Nation in Saskatchewan takes over from interim executive director <u>JP Gladu</u>, who will continue to support IRN as an advisor.
- Peyto Exploration & Development Corp. has promoted Riley Frame to vice-president, engineering. Frame, who joined Peyto in 2013, has spent the last three years as the manager of exploitation, playing an integral role in directing the company's development plans.
- PetroShale Inc. has appointed Anthony Baldwin as vice-president, business development. Most recently serving as president of Crescent Point Energy U.S. Corp., Baldwin has more than 17 years of oil and gas experience in leadership and business development roles.
- Mimi Lai will be retiring from Prairie Provident Resources Inc. as EVP finance and chief financial officer (CFO) and director to pursue new opportunities. This move will be effective March 31, 2022. The company is currently searching for a new CFO, and aims to have a replacement in place by early Q2 2022.

The new chair of the board will be appointed after Advantage's annual general and special meeting in May 2022.
